4. My husband would come home exhausted because of the huge responsibility of keeping our family afloat. We had to cut back drastically and even borrow money. There was nothing in my bank account and for the first time in my adult life I had no cash of my own. It felt degrading to do the weekly shopping using my husband's money.
5. Then one day my husband suggested I try to be my own boss. [...] The first day looking for work was painful. But eventually, I got my first assignment, and then another – and another. My future is not going to be the one I used to imagine, and I still miss the regular income. But my confidence grew, and I felt an old part of me come alive.
